It is also stated that this building will be the first in Malaysia to receive a triple platinum rating from worldwide sustainability certifications, including Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED). Just as the Burj Khalifa, the Merdeka 118 will be a different precinct with retail, business, residences, hotels, entertainment, four

launch in the Middle East this year, following its successful introduction of flights between Jeddah (KSA) and Kuala Lumpur in August. dnata Representation Services will act as the airline's general sales agent (GSA) in the UAE, providing a comprehensive range of travel services and local infrastructure for sales, marketing and distribution support. In Malaysia, cosmopolitan Kuala Lumpur and the beautiful coastlines beyond - including Langkawi - are increasingly popular. Malaysia is rapidly gaining recognition as a vibrant destination, known for its natural beauty, cultural richness, and warm hospitality, with a growing significance for business partnerships and cultural exchanges. With the

launch of direct flights from Dubai to Kuala Lumpur, travellers now will have easier access to explore the country. Whether planning a leisurely getaway, a family vacation, or a business trip, the affordable fares make exploring Malaysia more accessible than ever before.

Flight OD714 departs from Dubai International (DXB) every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday at 4:05 am, arriving in Kuala Lumpur (KUL) at 3:35 pm (local time). The return flight, OD713, operates on Monday, Wednesday, Friday, and Sunday, departing at 11:05 pm (local time) and arriving at DXB at 2:25 am. The airline operates its Dubai service with a brandnew Boeing 737-8 aircraft,

with 12 Business Class and 150 Economy Class seats. Meals and drinks are available for sale on board all Batik Air flights. The airline also offers a selection of prepurchased meals and additional baggage allowance at discounted rates.
